GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN - WW1 HISTORY WORKSHOP

Thank you to Bonalbo Central School for inviting our school to participate in the 'Gone but Not Forgotten' WW1 History Workshop last Thursday. Our students had a wonderfully engaging day absorbing a variety of interesting facts about the life of a WW1 soldier.

ENVISION HANDS PROJECT

Envision Hands is a not-for-profit community initiative that uses 3D printing to turn plastic waste into mobility aids and disability aids for young people. This small community focused organisation have collected over 1,000,000 bottle caps throughout Australia and using cutting edge 3D printing, have processed these once nuisance throw away items into mobility aids and prosthetics for kids.

With the help of Rotary and Lions Australia, Envision through its Helping Hands Project is aiming to collect 2,000,000 bottle caps.
